Dr Adriana Kiss, Water Policy Welsh Government The group's main objective is to identify chemical substances and associated issues, such as AMR and microplastics, which present a threat to water quality in Wales and assist the Welsh Government's long-term policy development



- Started as an informal gathering and discussions between Natural Resources Wales (NRW) and Welsh Government policy teams
- Based on NRW's chemicals investigation programme (passive monitors)
- Identified wider interest in Wales and beyond Wales
- Placed on a more formal footing with a Terms of Reference
- Regular monthly/bi-monthly meetings
- Network and group is growing

What did we find?

Everything ends up in water

NRW Chemicals Investigation Programme provides an interesting and useful dissection of society (nicotine, caffeine and lifestyle drugs)

Pharmaceuticals represent a high proportion of substances found in water in Wales

Concern are (more or less) the same for drinking water and environmental water quality

Emerging threats is a fast-evolving area

Lots of interest at Wales and UK level

Complex issues – mixtures and interactions
