Project Background



Disposable Cups are used for almost half of the purchased hot drinks



Only 0.25% of disposable cups are recycled



Over 2.5 billion cups are discarded annually in the UK



The transition to Circular Economy requires a **collective system-wide changes** (e.g., Amir et al., 2020)



Increased **circular ecosystem perspective** (e.g. Trevisan et al., 2022)



Limited empirical studies on transition from traditional to circular ecosystems and business models




About the Project

The Refill Return Cup Scheme for Cardiff City Centre introduces a circular business model for reusable coffee cups in an effort to reduce single-use plastic waste and make Cardiff a more sustainable and greener city.





How does the Refill-Return Cup Scheme work?



Customer is only charged £3 if they do not return the cup (or if they return a broken/incomplete cup)



Research aims, question and objectives

Research Aim:

to explore the development of a circular ecosystem through the implementation of the Refill Return cup scheme in Cardiff

Research Question 1: How can a scalable Refill Return Cup Scheme be generated?

Objectives:

- To explore the foundational principles of establishing, implementing and launching a circular "Refill-Return Cup Scheme"
- To explore challenges and enablers for Refill-Return Cup Schemes

Research Question 2: How is a circular ecosystem impacting the scalability of a Refill-Return Cup Scheme? Objectives:

- To identify the impact of "Refill-Return Cup Scheme" on circular ecosystems
- To develop a blueprint for Refill Return Cup Schemes.



Methodology & Data Collection

Longitudinal approach (October'24 – March'25)

Three phases to evaluate and monitor the scheme's progress:

Phase 1: Pre-Implementation Phase 2: Implementation Phase 3: Maintenance

Data Collection across the phases:

- Evaluation meetings / interviews with key facilitators at the end of each phase
- Survey for Café managers/ members of staff
- Survey with End-consumer
- Interviews with Café Managers/members of staff
- Focus Groups with Café Managers/members of staff



Data Collection & Pre-liminary Results: Phase 1: Pre-implementation

Data Collection:

- Survey with Café Managers/members of staff to understand the baseline
- Evaluation meetings with key facilitators

Pre-liminary results / learnings on Process Barriers & Enablers

- Training sessions are key (Group training vs. Individual training)
- Refill App
- Public Awareness of Refill App (e.g. soft launch)
- Café Recruitment and marketing activities
- Operational Support for Cafes (e.g. with display of reusable cups, support with app)
- One point of contact for cafes



Outlook

Next Steps

- Evaluation of 2nd Phase
- Interviews with Cafes
- End-consumer survey
- Modelling of Coffee Cup flow
- Carbon Emission Reduction
- Display of a circular ecosystem including the activities
- Development of a scalable blueprint
